Chairman Ross-Raymond called meeting to order at 6:30 PM . It was noted that Kathie has had her knee surgery and will be home soon to begin her recovery.

REGULAR BUSINESS:

- Review and Approve Minutes of last meeting
 - April 18th, 2012 – **Selectwoman Sheldon motioned to accept the summary as written, Selectman Ballou seconded. Vote in affirmative.**
- Review Accounts Payable & Payroll registers: **Selectman Ballou motioned to accept and Selectwoman Sheldon seconded. Vote in affirmative.**

Department Heads:

- Road Agent MacDuffie in for monthly update and reported it's dry and dusty on the dirt roads. He added that there's a beaver problem at Greenough and that F & G assigns someone from the area to trap them.
- Police Logs – April: Selectman Ross-Raymond noted the number of police calls for service as reported by NH State Police for April is a total of 29 calls. The specific data on each service call is available at the Selectmen's Office.

Pete reported that he had no further information at this time.

TA Warren reported that the Building Inspector did view the dilapidated building at the corner of West Salisbury Road and Old Turnpike Road, to follow up on a citizen complaint submitted to the Selectmen. BI Bodien's concerns are that there appears to be power still going to the building which has numerous broken windows, and the roof is caving in. Letter to be sent from the Board to the owner, with copy to Unital, to request the power be disconnected and request contact on what further actions will be done to make the site safe.

Update on Flood Control Reimbursement – an email was rec'd reference the outcome of the recent Legislative action to advise that the wording from last year in HB2 was removed and will be effective July 1, 2013, meaning we'll still lose out for 2012 but that it would be reinstated in full for the next state budget. The committee is including language that would require the state to reimburse the towns for lost revenue from 2011 and 2012 in full if Mass. pays up but if not then a 50% reimbursement in 2013 and then in 2014. A big thank you to Senator Andy Sanborn for all his hard work on behalf of the towns involved.

New Business:

- TA Warren reported that a representative of Senator Kelly Ayotte's office would be holding office hours at the Selectmen's Office on 5/22nd (11:30 to 12:30) if anyone has any questions for the Senator.
- We rec'd notification from the State that they are reviewing the number of street lights on State highways to determine where or how many can be turned off. We recently obtained a listing of the street lights in Salisbury and most appear to be on State highways, will wait to see what they report back to us.
- Chairman Ross-Raymond noted that he has been in touch with Lt. Armaganian at Troop D about the Community Open House being held by the Salisbury Fire & Rescue and he advised he will try to have someone present.
- At this time Pete asked about Old Home Day coverage and it was discussed that State Police has been made aware and will try to cover that day.
- Chairman Ross-Raymond noted he attended the Boscawen Selectmen's meeting earlier this evening and that they are planning a meeting for Wednesday, May 23rd at 7 PM in Boscawen to discuss concerns for education.
- Legislative Hearing was held today in Concord reference HB1403 concerning a moratorium on IB and to set up a committee to study the program more.

Other: All business that shall legally come before the Board

- Non-Public Session: per RSA 91-A:3, II (c) tax abatement issue request. At 7:30 PM Chairman Ross-Raymond made motion to go into non-public session **per RSA 91-A:3, II (c) tax abatement issue. Roll Call vote taken – unanimous vote.**

Returned to public session at 7:55 PM. Chairman Ross-Raymond announced motion was made and accepted by the Board to seal the non-public session minutes due to issue being a tax matter.

Selectman Ballou made motion to adjourn at 7:55 PM; Selectwoman Sheldon seconded. All voted in favor.
